UTAH STATE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAM APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO TEACHER EDUCATION & INSTRUCTIONS

One semester before you begin the Secondary Teacher Education Program, submit this completed application, signed by the content advisors for your content areas. Deadlines: Fall admission for Spring classes – Oct. 1, Spring admission for fall classes – Mar. 1.

Admission to Teacher Education must be approved by both the Secondary Education Program and the office of the Associate Dean for Education. Applicants must first be recommended by advisors for their teaching majors and teaching minors and then by the advisor in the Secondary Education Program. The application form and all required documentation are then submitted to the Associate Dean for formal approval, and students will then be permitted to register for courses in the Teacher Education program.

To begin the admission process, read and understand all admission criteria, then meet with your major advisor and fill out Parts I and II of the Admission Application together. After your major and minor advisors have signed the application form, schedule an appointment with a Secondary Education Advisor to complete the process. To schedule an advising appointment, students should call 435-797-0391.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- ACT** minimum scores required in each area with a composite score of at least 21. Scores may be attained by advisor on Banner or official documentation is required.
- Course work.** Complete core courses with minimum grades as listed on front of application.
- Speech & Hearing Test results.** Speech-language-Hearing screenings will be offered 4-6 hrs per week during weeks 3-15 every Fall and Spring semester. Sign-up sheets with the designated days and times available for screenings are located outside the office of the Department of Communicative Disorders & Deaf Education in the Lillywhite Building. The cost of the screening is \$10.00. Passing this test is not a requirement for admission; however, students with identified problems in speech and/or hearing are referred to the Disability Resource Center for services. The test results should be attached to the Application Form.
- Teacher Education Writing Exam results.** Take the Teacher Education Writing Exam in the Young Educational Technology Center (YETC) during weeks 1-5 of each semester. You and your advisor will be notified of the result of your exam. A passing score is required for admission. If you do not pass, you will be given information on options for remediation and for retaking the exam.
- Transcript of Credits.** Submit transcripts with your application to the advising office of Teacher Education and Leadership. The transcripts must document at least 60 semester credits completed and a minimum 3.00 Overall GPA. Currently enrolled students must provide a USU transcript; graduate and/or transfer students must provide transcripts from institutions previously attended. Transcripts do not have to be official, but they must be current.
- Criminal Background Check.** The Application for Criminal Background Check is now completed online. The web address is www.utah.gov/teachers. You will need to complete the fingerprinting at the USU Police Station. You can call 797-1939 to arrange an appointment. **Include a copy of your email from the USOE stating your background check has cleared.** **Please understand that it is your responsibility to inform the School of Teacher Education and Leadership if you have been arrested or convicted of violating any law except minor traffic violations while you are a student in the program. Failure to disclose this information can affect your current status in the Teacher Education Program. Signing this form indicates that you understand and agree to comply with this requirement.*
- Petition to Waive the ACT and Overall GPA admission requirements.** . The student must also fall into one of three categories to be eligible: 1. Non-traditional student with sole care-giver responsibilities, 2. Secondary Education student whose area of consideration is outside of their content area. 3. Under-represented populations. Students who do not meet the ACT and 3.0 GPA requirements may be eligible to submit a petition to be considered for a waiver of these requirements. The student must have a minimum GPA of a 2.75 and have attempted to retake the ACT or have attempted the ACT a minimum of two times. Students can obtain a petition waiver from a Secondary Education advisor. Petitions will be reviewed each fall and spring semester one week after priority registration. The School of Teacher Education and Leadership is only permitted to admit 10% of any given admission cohort through a waiver.
